Dr. Levine recently retired after a forty-year career with Kaiser Permanente, serving in an executive leadership role for The Permanente Medical Group (TPMG) since 1991, and as Executive Vice President for External Affairs for The Permanente Federation since 2015. She held multiple leadership roles within the medical group and within Kaiser Permanente nationally, and provided leadership in the domains of clinical education, management training and leadership development for the group's physicians; and in partnership with leadership in Kaiser Foundation Health Plan, government and community relations, health policy and external affairs; and pharmacy policy and drug use management.
